

Psychiatric Pharmacy Residency Program

This joint PGY2 program at the Center for Behavioral Medicine (CBM) and Northwest Missouri Psychiatric Rehabilitation Center (NMPRC), in affiliation with the UMKC School of Pharmacy, has two ASHP accredited PGY2 positions available for the period July 1 to June 30 annually. As a member of the pharmacy staff, the residents will provide pharmaceutical care to Department of Mental Health clients in two state operated facilities. The resident will work to improve care of the seriously mentally ill through an interdisciplinary team process. In addition, the resident will contribute to improving and enhancing the psychopharmacy training program.

CBM (formerly Western Missouri Mental Health Center) is located in the heart of Kansas City near the Crown Center complex and the new Power & Light District and Plaza areas. CBM operates regional psychiatric emergency services and currently houses 50 adult inpatient beds.

NMPRC is located in St. Joseph, Missouri approximately 50 miles north of Kansas City. St. Joseph is a historic Missouri town and the home of the Pony Express. NMPRC currently houses 108 adult long-term, inpatient beds with an emphasis in forensic psychiatry.

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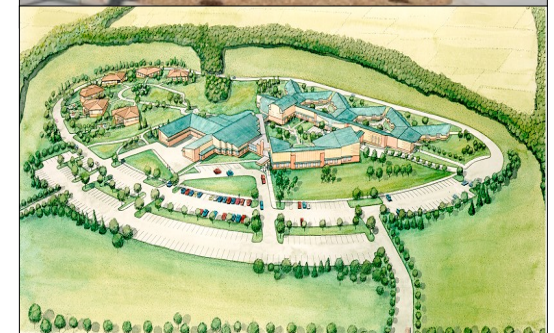

Special Features of the Program

The specialty residency provides an in-depth experience in the inpatient setting with a focus on acute and intermediate care psychiatry at the Center for Behavioral Medicine (CBM) and long-term forensic psychiatry at Northwest Missouri Psychiatric Rehabilitation Center (NMPRC). One resident position is available at each location. The resident participates in clinical patient care rounds, formal presentations including grand rounds and journal club presentations, inservices, residency and administrative projects, teaching, preparation of new drug monographs, completion and publication of research projects, and serves as a member of the Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee. The resident routinely precepts UMKC doctor of pharmacy and medical students. The residency program is affiliated with the UMKC School of Pharmacy and Pharmacy Systems, Inc. The resident is appointed adjunct faculty status with the UMKC School of Pharmacy for their residency year. Additional elective rotations are available in acute adult psychiatry, child and adolescent inpatient/outpatient psychiatry, neurology, forensic psychiatry, emergency psychiatric services, geriatric psychiatry, psychopharmacy research, consult-liaison service, or substance abuse.

Psychiatric Pharmacy Residency Program Mission

To provide a diverse environment and structured program which will allow the resident to develop the competencies and proficient skills necessary to become a successful clinical psychiatric pharmacist. Upon completion of this program, the pharmacist will be able to independently provide specialized pharmaceutical care to mentally ill patients in multi-disciplinary and collaborative settings.



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
