Pro-Active Student Success (PASS) Program

Goal:

Achieve student success with no more than 5% of any admitted class failing to progress because of their academic performance.

Objectives:

Identify students at risk of experiencing academic hardship within the first 8 weeks of their first semester.

Academic Success Risk Factors Identified at Admission

Cumulative GPA 2.5 to 2.75
Math/Science GPA 2.25 to 2.5
Pre-Requisite GPA 2.5 to 2.75
Multiple repeats or withdrawals over more than one semester

Assessment Process:

All students entering as P1's in the UMKC School of Pharmacy will be required to complete the following prior to Day 1 of classes starting:

Pharmacy School Boot Camp (10 modules with assessment) Grit-Grid Survey Academic Pharmacy Resilience Scale Cohen Perceived Stress Scale

Plan:

- 1. Students having at least one "Academic Success" risk factor will be required to meet with the Academic Learning Specialist within the first 4 weeks of the start of their first semester.
- Students achieving a Grit-Grid Survey score of < 0.9, a Cohen Perceived Stress Scale ≥ 27, or an Academic Pharmacy Resilience Score < 35 will be required to meet with the Academic Learning Specialist within the first 4 weeks of Semester 1.
- 3. Students failing one exam in two different classes within the first 4 weeks of Semester 1 will be required to meet with the Academic Learning Specialist.
- 4. Students failing 2 consecutive exams in the same course within the first 8 weeks of Semester 1 will be required to meet with the Academic Learning Specialist and attend two consecutive STEPS tutoring sessions for that course immediately following the receipt of the second exam failure.
- 5. Failure to comply with any of the above student success support actions will result in a Behavior Report and a required meeting with the ADSA.
