

Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experiences (APPE)

Continuum of required and elective experiences of the scope, intensity, and duration required to support achievement of the Educational Outcomes

Allows students to integrate, apply, reinforce, and advance the knowledge, skills, attitudes, abilities, and behaviors developed in the pre-APPE curriculum

Prepares "practice-ready" and "team-ready" graduates

Diverse populations

Interprofessional team practice

Patient care emphasis

Placement follows successful completion of all IPPE and required didactic curricular content

<1440 hours of experience during P4
<160 hours in each required APPE area

1 month rotations (160 hours)
9 months on rotation, 3 months off

UMKC APPE Curriculum

Advanced Community Pharmacy Practice

Builds on prior IPPE experiences

Focus is on patient care and management activities

CPESEN pharmacies given placement preference

Patient Care Selective (acute or ambulatory care)

Inpatient OR outpatient setting

Clinical role caring for patients with an interprofessional team

Various patient populations, disease states, and medicine subspecialties encountered

Acute Patient Care INPATIENT setting (in a hospital)

Clinical role caring for acutely ill patients with an interprofessional team

Varied conditions and patient populations encountered such as pediatrics, adult, and geriatrics

Health Systems Pharmacy Practice

OUTPATIENT setting (clinics and physician offices)

Clinical role caring for patients with chronic medical conditions such as HTN, diabetes, dyslipidemia, asthma, anticoagulation, etc.

Interprofessional team

Ambulatory Patient Care

Four elective rotations

Any required rotation type may be repeated as an elective

Maximum of 2 non-patient care electives allowed such as drug information, managed care, research, industry, professional organizations, academia, etc.

Electives I, II, III, and IV

Builds on prior IPPE experiences
Operations/medication delivery and distribution

Patient/medication safety

Transitions of care/medication reconciliation

Pharmacy policies and procedures, regulations

Management/financial/economic principles

Patient care throughout
