(Introductory Pharmacy Practice Experiences)

Purpose: Students will be involved in aspects of interprofessional practice that will involve shared patient care decision-making and professional ethics/behaviors. These IPPEs focus on both the delivery of care to patients and the dispensing of medications to achieve APPE readiness.



Minimum 300 hours of experience shared between community and health system settings

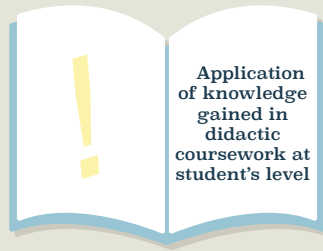
Placement: Purposely integrated into the didactic curriculum to consistently expose students to activities in graded fashion, and enable growth in knowledge, skills, and behavior.

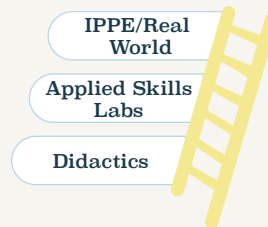

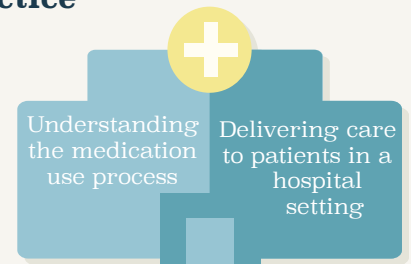

IPPE: General Medicine I



Continuum of patient care activities throughout the third professional year



Emphasizes the Pharmacist's Patient Care Process

Practice site time provides opportunities to engage in the provision of direct patient care while collaborating with other healthcare professions and improving rational drug therapy in a practice environment. Students take part in rounds, conferences, consultations, and other activities.
