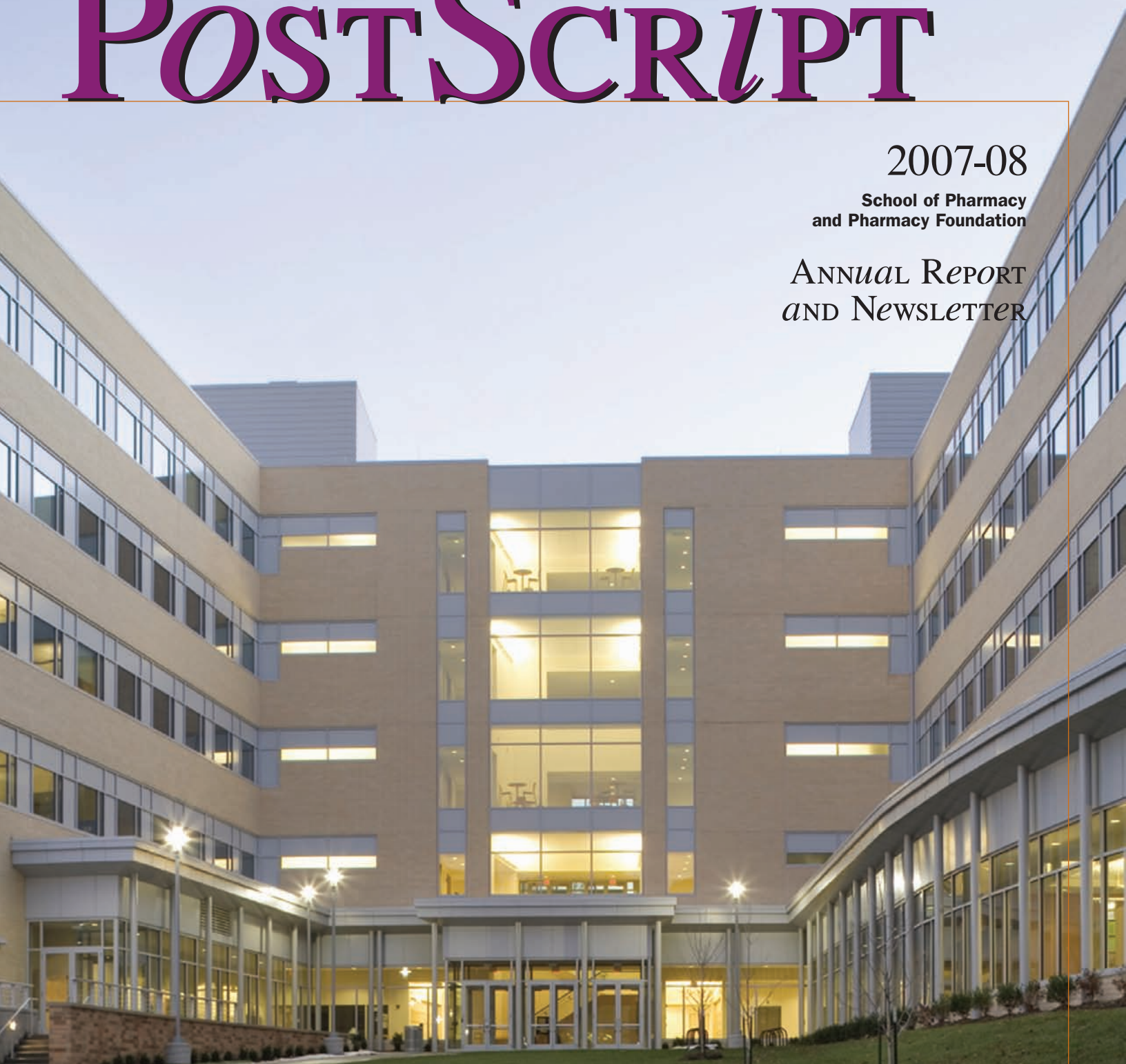

## UMKC SCHOOL OF PHARMACY

### Our Vision:

The UMKC School of Pharmacy will be a globally respected learning community, which creates higher standards in education, practice and research to improve health and quality of life.

### Our Mission:

The UMKC School of Pharmacy actively increases the level of patient care by its leadership in: educating students, health care practitioners, scientists and the public, partnering with the community and the entire health care team, and conducting innovative research.

### Our History:

Organized in 1885 as the Pharmaceutical Department of the University of Kansas City, the School was reorganized and reincorporated in 1898 as the Kansas City College of Pharmacy and Natural Science. In 1943, the forerunner of the present school joined the University of Kansas City as its third professional school. When the University of Kansas City was incorporated into the University of Missouri System in 1963, the School of Pharmacy became the only state-supported pharmacy school in Missouri. In October 1985, the School commemorated 100 years of progress in pharmaceutical education, research and service. The School of Pharmacy is a member of the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy (AACCP). The Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE) provides full accreditation for the doctor of pharmacy program through 2009.

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## The Dean's Corner

Over the years, many people have told me that seven was a "lucky number." However, my academic experiences included surviving statistics courses at both the professional and graduate level, and these tend to refute the concept of any special attributes for individual numbers. Nonetheless, 2007 was truly a watershed year for the School of Pharmacy. In August, we moved into our new home in the Health Sciences Building on the Hospital Hill campus. In September, Governor Matt Blunt and a host of government and university officials officially "cut the ribbon." Following that ceremony, the School of Pharmacy cut the ribbon on 16 individual rooms that were contributed by many of our alumni and friends in the Pharmacy family. But what does this new facility really mean, since buildings are only bricks and mortar? To answer that question, one has to look beyond the bricks and mortar to the individual benefits to education, research and the profession. In terms of education, students in the School of Pharmacy are now being educated in state-of-the-art classrooms with complete two-way audio/video transmission for our satellite program in Columbia. Increased educational space has also allowed the School to admit the largest Pharm.D. entering class (123 students) in the history of the School of Pharmacy. This allows us to address the current and projected shortage of pharmacists in both our state and nation. The technology that is in place in the building allows the School to consider transmission of our coursework and continuing education programs to virtually anywhere in the world using similar A/V technology. We are also able to put lectures on a DVR, so that students unable to attend class can access the lectures on their home computers.



As those who have seen the building know, the School of Pharmacy shares educational space with the UMKC School of Nursing. This has provided tremendous opportunities for interdisciplinary education of our students in 21st century simulation laboratories. The chance for student pharmacists to interact with other student health care professionals provides invaluable experience for their role on today's health care team. The School is located adjacent to the School of Medicine and across the street from the School of Dentistry, a situation which provides even greater opportunity for these student professionals to learn about each other's disciplines and to interact in virtual interdisciplinary situations.

In order for the School to provide state-of-the-art education, it is important that our faculty be involved in research at the highest level. This past year, UMKC has ranked in the upper tertile of all schools of pharmacy in research funding generated per faculty member. In addition, three patents were also issued based on research conducted in the School of Pharmacy. One of our faculty members, Dr. Ashim Mitra, chair of the Division of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Curators' Professor, was the recipient of the 2007 research award from the Association for Research in Vision and Ophthalmology, which is the primary organization in the discipline. It is a tremendous honor for UMKC to have one of our researchers recognized at this level. Our research is supported by an excellent cadre of graduate students in the Division of Pharmaceutical Sciences graduate program, which has been recognized as one of the top programs of its kind in the country.

The School also continues to be a leader in terms of service provided to the University by our volunteers and students. Last year, UMKC School of Pharmacy preceptors and volunteers provided over 46,000 hours of service time, which represents 38 percent of all the volunteer service hours recorded by the entire UMKC campus. In economic terms, this represents approximately 23 FTE or, viewed another way, over \$2 million of pharmacist time equivalents. In addition, scholarship and grant support contributed increased approximately 70 percent to a total of \$112,000, and has allowed us to increase our number of scholarships awarded from a total of 70 to 99. These funds are critical for many of our students to be able to pursue their dream of a pharmacy degree. The total amount of gifts to the School, including funding for School of Pharmacy areas in the Health Sciences Building, was in excess of half a million dollars. This latter figure does not include planned giving commitments, which are also necessary for our continued growth.

As you flip through these pages and read of our accomplishments this past year, please know that all of us at the School of Pharmacy are grateful to you, our alumni and friends, for the contributions noted in the last paragraph and for the critical role that you play in all of the accomplishments noted above. I hope that you are pleased with the progress that the School of Pharmacy is making and with the caliber of our programs. We value the reputation of your alma mater, and work diligently to make sure that UMKC puts its best foot forward in our state and nation. As you read the 2007-08 Postscript, I hope that you will take pride in our efforts and share them with others. We are committed to maintaining the tradition of excellence that you have come to expect from the UMKC School of Pharmacy!

The School of Pharmacy satellite academic program located on the Columbia, Mo. campus is now well into their third year of operation and all signs point to success. A total of 84 UMKC School of Pharmacy students are presently enrolled in the Columbia campus program and they are enjoying their experiences on both the UMKC and University of Missouri location. Dr. Kathleen Snella, Assistant Dean and Vice Chair of the Doctor of Pharmacy Satellite Program said, "One of the most exciting things happening on the satellite campus is with our student organizations. The students have really blossomed with the addition of a local satellite APhA-ASP (Academy of Student Pharmacists) chapter as well as a dual-campus SSHP (Student Society of Health System Pharmacists) chapter. It has been very exciting to see the students help develop these organizations and take leadership roles. Additionally, the Class of 2010 is now eligible for the honor societies, Rho Chi and Phi Lambda Sigma." The students' academic courses continue to be offered to both the Kansas City and Columbia students through a combination of on-site instruction as well as classes that are transmitted between the School sites through Polycom interactive technology.

As the inaugural satellite group, the students of the Class of 2010 continue to experience all of their pharmacy activities for the first time, including the 2007 Professional Dedication Ceremony held in September. All third year students on both the Kansas City and Columbia campuses joined together for this special occasion where each scholar received their first professional pharmacy "white coat" and a gold pin that symbolizes their integrity, accountability, and compassion. With one year of classroom work still to go, the Class of 2010 looks forward to their senior year of experiential rotations in the Columbia community. Dr. Mary Euler, Associate Dean of the School of Pharmacy said, "The Columbia satellite program has allowed us to educate future health care practitioners who might not have been able to pursue a career in pharmacy, while bringing to Missouri a talented and dedicated pool of pharmacists who will help alleviate the shortage of pharmacists in our state."

As Eric Wombwell's fifth and final year of pharmacy school draws to a close, it becomes clear that he has set the bar high for excellence in academic achievements and personal leadership skills. In campus, pharmacy school and community-level programs, Eric has created a lasting impression through his volunteer efforts.

As an active member in the American Pharmacists Association-Academy of Student Pharmacists organization (APhA-ASP), Eric created the "ROOT for Health" initiative that focuses on addressing the problems of childhood obesity by educating children on how to eat wisely and staying active on a daily basis. The goal of the four-week program is to help fourth grade children make smart choices in the foods they eat and the activities in which they participate. As his motivation for establishing the program, Eric felt that "Maybe if we educate kids at an earlier age on how to lead a healthy life we wouldn't see them have so many health concerns later on." In recognition of his volunteer efforts, the UMKC ASP chapter received the "Chapter Innovative Programming" national award in 2006.

Eric's academic work also recently received recognition during the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP) Midyear Clinical Meeting in December 2007. Out of over 90 schools of pharmacy, Eric and his partner, Joseph Woolery (Class of 2008), placed in the top 10 of the national Clinical Skills Competition. They are the first student team from UMKC to finish in the top 10 at an ASHP competition. Eric felt that he and Joe were ready for the challenge due to the high quality of their own therapeutics courses at the School of Pharmacy. "It was great preparation for us for the competition," said Eric.

In his spare time, Eric enjoys baseball and following college football games, especially the "Fighting Irish" of Notre Dame. Eric also teaches the 13-week pharmacy technician certificate course at Penn Valley Community College. Following his graduation in May, Eric will participate in a pharmacy residency program at the Veterans Administration Medical Center in Kansas City, Mo. and then seek a career in pharmacy academia. Eric says that he has "always enjoyed teaching" and sees great future opportunities through the program expansion plans of UMKC.

## Division of Pharmacy Practice Professor brings new opportunities to School

The School of Pharmacy is pleased to announce the appointment of Jack E. Fincham, Ph.D., R.Ph. as professor in the Division of Pharmacy Practice. Dr. Fincham has enjoyed a rewarding research and teaching career in the field of pharmacy specializing in patient compliance with medication regimens, drug use with the elderly, health economic comparisons, smoking cessation and public health. Among his many prestigious academic appointments, Dr. Fincham has served as a Kellogg Fellow in the Clinical Sciences Program of the University of Minnesota College of Pharmacy, as Dean of the School of Pharmacy at the University of Kansas, and most recently as the Albert W. Jowdy Professor at the University of Georgia College of Pharmacy. “Each of these experiences provided me with great colleagues to work with – I have really been blessed,” said Dr. Fincham.

Dr. Fincham’s work with the School of Pharmacy will include teaching “Pharmacy Management” and continuing his extensive research projects. He is currently involved in a collaborative venture that includes faculty members from the UMKC Bloch School of Business and the School of Dentistry, studying the rise of “immediate care” medical clinics as a viable health care option for consumers and how this option is being viewed by the patient.

He has published ten books, including *Taking Your Medicine: A Guide to Medication Regimens and Compliance for Patients and Caregivers*. Dr. Fincham is nationally regarded as an expert in his field and often called upon for his professional opinion from a variety of news sources including *Newsweek* magazine, National Public Radio, and most recently with the international media corporation, Univision.com. As a long-time friend, colleague and former instructor to Dr. Fincham, Dean Robert Piepho of the School of Pharmacy reflected that “I have known Jack for over a quarter of a century and watched his career with admiration. It is always nice to watch a former student grow into an international expert in his field.”

As a native of north central Kansas, Dr. Fincham and his wife Melinda were happy to return to the Kansas City area. He attributes his personal drive and energy as coming from his own family. “I thoroughly enjoy just being with my kids and wife and doing everything or simply doing nothing – they are my heroes.” He views his new position at the UMKC School of Pharmacy as a chance for innovative partnerships and opportunities. “The colleagues here in my department, at the School and across the campus really collaborate well together – it is a great atmosphere,” said Dr. Fincham.

No matter what she does, be it patient care, research, teaching rotation students or course coordination – she does it with all her heart, soul and a commitment to excellence."

Maqual remains an active member of the Foundation board following her term as president and will work with Executive Director Mary Euler, Pharm.D. and the board in the coming year to continue seeking scholarship support for the programs of the School of Pharmacy. 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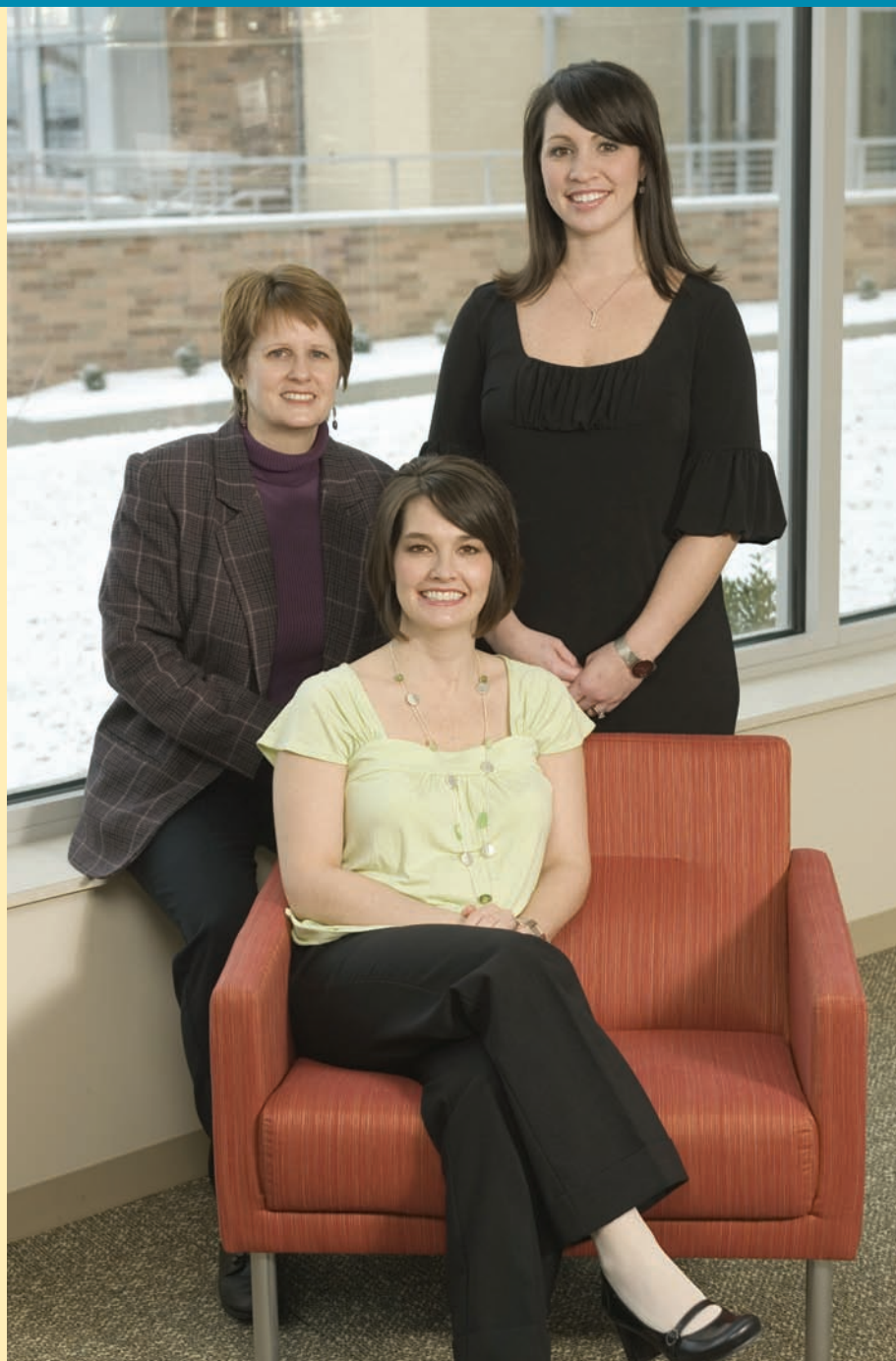
