**Class of 2018 Graduate Satisfaction**

- **97.8%** of UMKC graduates as compared to **94.6%** of graduates nationally agreed or strongly that they are prepared to enter pharmacy practice
- **86.1%** of UMKC graduates as compared to **77.6%** of graduates nationally agreed or strongly that that if they were starting their career again they would chose pharmacy
- **91.2%** of UMKC graduates as compared to **82.2%** of graduates nationally would choose the same pharmacy program if starting again
  - UMKC exceeds the national rate for program satisfaction as measured by all three questions for **five** consecutive years.
