Activity	Primary Educational Outcome Category	Supporting Coursework/Description
Oath of a Pharmacist-all students required	4.4. Professionalism	This activity is completed as part of Orientation. It serves as the students' first experience with the Oath and Code of Ethics. Discussions center around the student's understanding of the important role they have within patient care and the expectations for professional performance always.
Professional Requirements of Interns-all students required	4.4. Professionalism	Non-Curricular requirements (e.g., TB testing, immunizations) and 7101 lecture. This activity captured student's views on these requirements and to help them understand the many necessary pieces a professional must have completed or have available to be safe around patients/public and to notify licensing bodies of their intent to practice.
CAPSTONE-all students required	4.1 Self-Awareness	7101-Students complete multiple surveys to gain insight into how they learn and approach their school work. An end of the semester assignment is completed by the student to capture what they learned from each survey and how they are going to apply the information in the future. The co-curricular aspect inserts a faculty discussion with the student to individualize the messaging and provide a framework for future success.

Selective #1 <sup>2</sup>	3.2. Education	7279 and (7414/7414L)-Students will extract principles concurrently from coursework and apply by selecting from a listing of opportunities or create their own with the approval of the DCC. This will also help to fill a void until the P3 year.
Selective #2 <sup>2</sup>	4.2. Leadership	7101-Students will independently select leadership experiences to participate that will enhance their skills for future leadership opportunities.

<sup>1</sup> Students must complete all 3 Fall requirements. Submission of the Oath of a Pharmacist and Professional Requirements for Interns need to be uploaded into Evaluate by November 15<sup>th</sup>. The CAPSTONE discussion will occur during finals week. The student must meet with their advisor as a group or individually no later than the CAPSTONE discussion.

<sup>2</sup> Students who participate in Education and Leadership activities from December 1-April 15 can count them toward these P1 Spring semester requirements. Students can select from pre-approved opportunities available on the Pharmacy Co-Curricular Blackboard site. Educational Outcome categorizes these opportunities. Students may also work with the Director of Co-Curriculum (DCC) to create their own.
